Enclosed is your Permit to Operate a Farm Labor Camp Commissary

Enclosed is your Permit to Operate a Farm Labor Camp Commissary, together with the Commissary's Price List.

Your Permit and Commissary's Price List must be posted conspicuously in the commissary at all times.

Section 197.6 of the Commissioner of Labor's Regulations requires that the Commissary's Price List show the current prices charged for all goods sold or leased, including meals. The charge for an item may not be higher than the price shown on the list.

You must maintain records for each farm worker, showing: (1) the charges for meals and lodging provided to the worker by the commissary operator; (2) the deductions made from the worker's wages for the benefit of the commissary operator; and (3) the name of the grower or processor by whom the worker was employed. Such records must be maintained for at least three years and must be readily available for inspection by the Commissioner of Labor or his duly authorized representative.

The Commissioner of Labor may revoke or suspend a Permit as provided in Section 197.4(b) of the Commissioner of Labor Regulations. Note particularly, that the Permit may be revoked or suspended upon notification by the State Department of Health that the permit holder has failed to comply with the State Sanitary Code for Migrant Labor Camps.
